



French - Progression Map, Intent, Implementation and Impact

French is taught in LKS2, using a two-year rolling programme, giving a basis for further learning in UKS2 when the children transition to Middle School. Each teacher delivering the learning has attended external training, which places emphasis on the key skills of the KS2 languages programme of study, i.e. practical communication, phonics, intercultural understanding, grammatical structures and stories, songs and poems.

Our learning is interactive, using music and video, as well as memory actions in class. Whilst we cover a lot of material orally, an area for development is in the writing of some familiar words and phrases without help, as well as developing simple assessment systems.

Intent

Our aim is that all pupils will develop a genuine interest and positive curiosity about foreign languages. Learning French as a second language will offer pupils the opportunity to explore relationships between language and identity, develop a deeper understanding of other cultures and the world around them with a better awareness of self, key individuals and cultural differences. The intention is that pupils will feel able and encouraged to continue studying languages beyond Year 4 and ultimately be working towards becoming life- long language learners.

Implementation

At the end of Year 4, all children will:

- listen attentively to spoken language and show understanding by joining in and responding,
- explore the patterns and sounds of language through songs and rhymes, and link the sound and meaning of words,
- engage in conversations; ask and answer questions; express opinions and respond to those of others,
- speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures,
- develop accurate pronunciation and intonation so that others understand when they are using familiar words and phrases,
- appreciate stories, songs, poems and rhymes in the language,
- describe people, places, things and actions orally.

Impact

Our MFL curriculum aims to ensure that all pupils develop key language learning skills set out by the national curriculum, as well as a love of languages and learning about other cultures. Children will have an understanding and appreciation of French culture and language, and of the things we share in-common. They will have a base of early practical phrases, in preparation for their language learning journey, no matter what language they study at year 5 and beyond.
